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ore than 80% of men report struggling with online pornography. Now with pornography available on cell phones, this number is expected to increase, leading to sexual addiction in epidemic proportions.

What is sexual addiction? According to Patrick Carnes, Ph.D., "sexual addiction is any kind of sexuallyrelated, compulsive behavior which interferes with normal living causing severe stress on family, friends and one's work environment." These compulsive behaviors become the addict's priority, causing him to risk losing everything he cherishes most. Sexual addiction destroys relationships.



Joy Bocanegra is a Licensed Professional Counselor and facilitates the therapy group Betrayal of the Heart. She also sees clients in our Orland Park, IL office. Sexual addiction is shrouded in secrecy as shame plagues the individual. The addict's partner also suffers in secret, too embarrassed and ashamed to talk about it. Women whose partners have a sexual addiction typically feel betrayed, angry, lonely, depressed, and anxious and often wonder if they're just plain crazy.

Betrayal of the Heart offers a safe place for these women to share their pain. This six week therapy group is designed to help women find hope and healing as they move past betrayal and brokenness. The group's focus is on the woman and her healing regardless of whether or not her partner is in recovery.

Betrayal of the Heart will meet at the Orland Park Office for six sessions from 7:00pm to 8:30pm on Mondays, beginning September 21st. Topics to be addressed include, dealing with the myriad of emotions, establishing boundaries, letting go of what's not theirs, grieving losses, practicing good self-care, forgiveness, and continuing the healing process. A free initial individual session will be scheduled to determine group eligibility. Future group dates TBA. For more information call 708-845-5500.

Did I FALL as a Parent?

A s a parent, many of you know the pain of watching one of your children make poor choices that you know will hurt them. You may see their faith shattered by something and wonder about your parenting....Did I fail? Was there more I could have done? Counselors often wonder the same when it seems like we have little or no impact on a person. Parents sometimes get to hear the "rest of the story," counselors seldom do.

Once in awhile God allows us a glimpse and I want to share this one with you to encourage you if you are watching a child taking a potentially harmful path in life. I had the privilege of lunch with a former client who had contacted me.

When I saw him about 16 years ago he was about 20 years old, separated from his wife, and wanting out of his marriage. He was abusing pot and alcohol. After most of our sessions I felt hopeless. In fact, I don't remember ever feeling that I did anything to really help him. I think I may have terminated treatment with him because he was wasting my time and his money since he had no intention of staying with his wife. That's the backdrop to this lunch.

Several months later he fell off a ladder while at work and had a serious closed head injury. He spent several weeks in a hospital. It was during this hospital stay that some of his parent's words (and maybe some of mine) began to make sense; he accepted the fact that his life's priorities were out of whack and he needed to make some changes. He told me that it was my integrity in my own marriage that spoke louder to him than anything he remembers me saying. It took several months for his wife to think seriously about by Bruce Frens, Executive Director

reconciling, but God worked in her heart too to bring about her ability to forgive. I was in awe of how God used painful circumstances to bring this guy "home."

It was in the hospital that he recommitted his life to Christ and to his family. I learned that he and his wife now have two children and are still married. He has been working for over 15 years full-time and is devoted to his family. He is involved in his church as a member of the praise team.

So, even when you think you may have "failed" as a parent, know that God may still use something you've said or done...for His glory. God can use the most painful circumstances in a child's life to bring them "home" to Him. As counselors, we know our counseling offices are "Holy Ground" – so are our homes.

So...what is Marriage Enrichment?

But what exactly does the word "enrich" mean? Webster's definition is "to give a greater value, importance, effectiveness, etc." The goal, then, of these offerings must be to teach people how to make their marriage a higher priority.

But why do we have to LEARN how to do this? Don't we (especially as Christians!) already know the extreme importance of this relationship? After all, Jesus Himself uses the illustration of the bride and the bridegroom to describe His relationship with His followers.

So where, then, do our troubles as husbands and wives begin? Often, many problems arise from our belief systems. We all have some faulty beliefs, assumptions, or expectations. One of the most widely held beliefs, in our culture today, is that "We can have it all!" No, we can't! Something has to give, and many times it is our marriage.

In our attempts to "have it all," we, also, get caught in the web of believing we can "be all" and "do all" as well. As we become busier and busier, we can begin to experience a loss of love and affection for our spouse. If you have become disillusioned with your marriage and are feeling increasingly "out of touch" with your partner, you are not alone. by Diane Kapp, MA, LMFT

Some of the most common symptoms include an absence of acts of kindness or thoughtfulness, little or no affectionate touching, infrequent sexual interaction, no verbalizations of love, little time spent on social or recreational activities and infrequent communication about intimate matters.

We married our partner to always have the pleasure of their company. If the joy and connection that you once had hoped for is no longer present in your relationship, the Creator God provides ways to change what is not "working" in your marriage. Therapists, through counseling and presentations offered to the community, can teach you how to truly enrich your partnership.
